She has a long Christian history, but recent decades have seen secularization increasingly dominate.

The evangelical protestant church is generally growing, and relations between pastors and denominations are improving. Relations between Catholics and Protestants, historically strained, are also improving; partly due to the significant loss of power by the Catholic Church caused by the rapid ascent of secularism. So Catholics look to other Christians for support, especially evangelicals whose moral values closely resemble their own.

## **Praying for Prodigals**

"For I, the LORD, do not change; therefore you, O sons of Jacob, are not consumed. From the days of your fathers you have turned aside from My statutes and have not kept them—Return to Me, and I will return to you..." Malachi 3:6–7

A prodigal is a person that no longer chooses to live in the presence of the Father. First we grieve with Him, then we enter into His compassionate rescue.

### 1. REVELATION

Ask God to reveal Himself to you afresh. • *remember, recall, respond* 

- (Psalm 103, Lamentations 3:21-25, Hosea 6:1-3)
- *realign yourself with the Word of God* (Isaiah 55, Acts 3:19, 1Corinthians 2:9)
- *rejoice in who He is* (Exodus 34:5–7, Isaiah 40, Jeremiah 9:23–24)

#### 2. RESEARCH

Ask God for His heart for the loved one. (Luke 15, Isaiah 49:24-25)

#### 3. REBUILD

Ask God for His purposes. Ask Him to do the things only He can do. (Jeremiah 1:9–10, 29:11, Colossians 1:13)

For your encouragement, what follows is how He led a few others to "build."

I took the Word of God to build a structure for my prayers, the way a carpenter does to frame a house. For example, I prayed through the book of Ephesians. Where it says in 1:1, "Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God," I prayed: "John, called, set apart according to the will of God." Then when it mentions a particular church, I prayed my prodigal would find a church and be faithful to Him. Verse 2 is a blessing, "grace and peace form God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." Everything became a prayer: that the loved one would experience God's grace and peace, know God as Father, know Jesus as Lord of their life, as Savior.

Through His word He gave me promises to pray—renewing my hope and encouraging me to pray with expectation—directing my behavior to let His love shine through.

Isaiah 29:24, 32:18, 49:24–25, 57:18–19; Proverbs 22:6 • Jeremiah 31:15–17 • Philippians 2:13, 1:9–11

Deuteronomy 11:1–9 has always defined the boundaries of my responsibility toward my children: *to fully love and obey God* (v. 1). Verse 9 offers the promise that my own obedience gains the "promised land" that will pass to them. In between, God reminds me that my life should be a testimony to His greatness and saving power, and Psalm 145 urges me to proclaim it. May God grant us understanding of how our individual faithfulness to Him opens doors to His mighty answers for our prodigals.

### Meditate on John 3:29–30 and ASK:

- Love for the Bride of Christ: Pray that Worship Leaders would learn to see the Bride through the eyes of Christ and to lay their lives down to serve her, following the example of Christ.
- The Humility of John the Baptist ("He must become greater; I must become less."): Pray for an increasing desire to see Christ glorified in the eyes of His Bride. This will require a decision for worship leaders to humble themselves and decide not to "steal the show."
- *The Maturing of a Prophetic Voice in Worship:* We want to actually hear from God in our present day and our present circumstances! We need the Holy Spirit's sensitivity for this.
- *Spirit-led Songwriting:* We need new expressions of worship that flow from the hearts of God's people today. This is one way for the Bride to declare her affections for Jesus, as she discovers new ways of expressing her love for Him.
